- A. Referrals: 122 new referrals in January 2016, CFC #14 has a total of 740 families at this time.
- B. Staffing updates: Amy J. is no longer with the CFC. Sheila R. and Catherin S. will cover the Henry/Stark area until a new SC's has been hired. Other SC's have been switched as needed to cover the families in the Peoria, Tazewell and Woodford areas.
- C. CFC #14 now is experiencing a shortage in Speech Therapists. Gary is considering contacting area schools to see if they could share their SLP's until new providers come forth or numbers drop off for the current providers.
